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













































































































NEXT: GET READY FOR THE BIG PAYBACK!

I'm hoping for more of a "standard" superhero, with a "black" angle. It's actually shocking sometimes how much of a "white" perspective is given to comics, movies, and books even when there is no racism involved.

I think (hope?) that you guys have learned that there's room for good, standard stories with a subtle shift toward the "black" perspective, as opposed to the "sledge-hammer" approach – always dealing with tough, black, and racist issues. After all the "sledge-hammer" approach usually ends up preaching to those who agree, and turning off those who don't.

By the way, let me take a moment to tell M. D. Bright that I think he's an absolutely excellent artist. He's one of the few (yes I'm unusual these days) artists whom I have followed from title to title, and I'm happy that he's so far stuck with comics that I enjoy. His facial expressions are excellent, as are his "outer-space" scenes (as seen in Valor, for instance.) The scene on Page twenty, with his flying with Rocket, is excellent, and would make a great poster. M. D. Bright's detail is always just perfect, too - not many blank backgrounds, but not so much detail or superfluous jiggling lines that offer nothing but the false appearance of more complex images. Pun intended.
